GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE –

for staff employed by Woolpit Parish Council (WPC)

- Informal grievance procedure In the interests of maintaining good working relations the
 employee is encouraged to first discuss any grievance with the Clerk, as Line Manager for all
 employees or Chairman of the Parish Council, as the Line Manager for the Clerk, with a view
 to resolving the matter informally if appropriate. If the employee feels that this is not
 appropriate, or he or she wishes to pursue a formal grievance they should follow the
 procedure detailed below.
- 2. Formal grievance procedure
 - 2.1 The employee must set out his/her grievance in writing ("Statement of Grievance") and provide a copy to the Chairman
 - 2.2 Once the WPC has had a reasonable opportunity to consider its response to the information provided in the Statement of Grievance, the employee will be invited to attend a grievance meeting with the Parish council to discuss the matter:
 - The employee must take all reasonable steps to attend the meeting.
 - Grievance meetings will normally be convened with 14 days of the WPC receiving the Statement of Grievance.
 - The employee has the right to be accompanied to a grievance meeting by a fellow employee or by a Trade Union representative.
 - If the meeting is inconvenient for either the employee or his or her companion, the employee has the right to postpone the meeting by up to 5 working days.
 - 2.3 A grievance meeting may be adjourned to allow matters raised during the meeting to be investigated, or to afford the time to consider the decision.
 - 2.4 After the meeting the employee will be informed of the WPC's decision within 5 working days. The meeting may be reconvened for this purpose. The decision will be confirmed to the employee in writing.
 - 2.5 If the employee wishes to appeal against the decision, he or she must inform the Chairman within 5 working days of receiving the decision. This is in conjunction with the Woolpit Parish Council's Disciplinary Policy appeals document paragraph 13 subsections 1, 5, 6.
 - 2.6 If the employee notifies the Chairman, that they wish to appeal, the employee will be invited to attend a grievance appeal meeting. The employee must take all reasonable steps to attend that meeting. The employee has the right to be accompanied to a grievance appeal meeting by a fellow employee or by a Trade Union representative.
 - 2.7 A grievance appeal meeting will normally be convened within 7 working days of the Chairman receiving notice that the employee wishes to appeal pursuant to 2.5 above. If the meeting time is inconvenient for the employee or his or her companion, the employee may ask to postpone the meeting by up to 5 working days.
 - 2.8 After the grievance appeal meeting the employee will be informed of the final decision within 5 working days. The meeting may be reconvened for this purpose. The decision will be confirmed to the employee in writing.
