MINUTES OF THE WOOLPIT PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 1 MARCH 2010 AT 7.30 P.M. IN WOOLPIT INSTITUTE

Present: Mr Wiley (Chairman), Rev Farrell, Mr Guyler, Mrs Parker and 1 member of the public.

Public comment: Mr Bolden NW Co-ordinator gave the Police report. There were 6 crimes reported between 1 & 26 February; 3 burglaries, 1 theft, 1 theft from a motor vehicle and 1 attempted theft from a motor vehicle. Metal thefts are occurring countywide and warnings of various telephone scams were given.

Mrs Parker advised that a further dog litter bin has been installed in Rectory Lane. The Clerk will advise MSDC.

Mrs Eburne will conduct a litter pick both side of the road between Vindis garage and Leggetts.

The County Councillor's report advised that SCC proportion of council tax will rise by 2.4%. The budget includes setting aside an extra £1.5m for road repairs following the recent bad weather and an extra £1.7m on front-line social workers.

Cllr Storey attended a workshop on the Big Freeze and the outcome will be used by SCC to deliver better service next time the weather is so severe. A report of the workshop was circulated to Cllrs.

Hedge in Mill Lane – the hedge beside the pavement is the responsibility of Suffolk Housing Society.

Rags Lane old allotments – the Clerk has spoken with Mr Scott regarding upkeep of the hedge.

Allotment rents – only 1 rent remains outstanding and the Clerk has sent a reminder letter to the tenant.

0477/10 Crown thin and lift 3 Hazel trees. Ladys Well, Elmswell Road – support

3720/09 Erection of attached garage to dwelling under construction under Outline Permission OL/164/03 and Reserved Matters approval 2446/07. Land adjacent to The Lanes, Warren Lane – support.

3492/09 Erection of single storey side extension. 36 Roman Fields. MSDC decision – permission granted.

3749/09 Erection of single storey attached annexe (following demolition of existing garage and store). 40 Briar Hill. MSDC decision – permission refused. The proposed annexe by reason of its poor design, excessive size, bulk and close proximity to northern boundary is considered to dominate the existing dwelling and would be detrimental to the character and appearance of the local area.

0022/10 Works to four Ash Trees as per schedule. Woolpit Village Hall, Mill Lane. MSDC decision – no objection.

EN/10/00034 MSDC is looking into a possible breach of planning control with the removal of trees at Brook House, Masons Lane.

7. To approve accounts for payment.

Woolpit Room Christian Fellowship £62.18 and St Mary's Church PCC £62.18 as 50% share of the money received from MSDC for delivering Mid Suffolk Messenger. Mr Wiley had attended but there was no attendance by parishioners to the disappointment of Suffolk Constabulary. Parking in Heath Road was put forward as an issue.

12. To receive a report from the Footpath Warden.

All footpaths are walkable but very muddy.

13. To receive a report from the Litter Picker.

Work was not so disrupted by the weather in February.

14. Rookery Farm, Drinkstone – update on current issues

Planning Law – MSDC has served Planning Enforcement notices. An appeal against the notices has been lodged.

Environmental Permit – The permit granted to John Clarke following an inquiry in 2008 has not yet been issued. MSDC legal team to see if this can be issued in the name of John Clarke following his recent death as the application was personal to Mr Clarke. In any event the operators will have to make an application to transfer the permit to the new operator.

Public Nuisance – the undertaking now falls away as this was personal to John Clarke.

There is a liaison meeting scheduled for 18 March which Mr Guyler will attend.
